

Mathematics

Acceleration is available to students in middle school. All students must pass three high school math courses to graduate. Students may progress through Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus and AP Calculus AB. AP Statistics can be taken as an elective.

Science

Acceleration is available to students in middle school. Regents coursework is offered in Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry & Physics. Advanced Placement courses are offered in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Environmental Science, Forensics and Anatomy & Physiology may be taken as electives.

World Language

Instruction begins in middle school. Most students earn one high school credit in grade 8. Spanish is offered for each grade level. AP Spanish is offered in grade 12. College credit is received from Schenectady County Community College for completion of Spanish A and AP Spanish.
